Wolverhampton Police and School Partnerships



INTRODUCTION

Wolverhampton Police are committed to partnership working and continually look for opportunities to work more closely with local partners to prevent, reduce and detect crime, anti-social behaviour and hate crime in the community

Police and School Objectives

- Diverting young people away from crime, anti-social behaviour and hate crime is an integral part of this commitment.
- Alleviate crime, antisocial behaviour and hate crime committed by young people who attend schools in the City of Wolverhampton.
- Facilitate a coordinated approach that allows the regular and consistent collective/exchange of relevant information between schools in Wolverhampton and police.
- Promote the safety and wellbeing of young people
- Ensure that young people at risk of involvement in such offending behaviour are identified early and appropriate support packages are developed and implemented.
- Improve safety of young people.
- Reduce exclusions and non-attendance at school.
- Improve behaviour.

How Police Support Schools:

- 'One Stop Shop'
 Police, School, Young person,
 Family YOS, Farly help and
 - Family, YOS, Early help and social care come together to discuss how to divert young person from gang/exploitation lifestyle.
- Violence awareness programme delivered over a period of a term to the schools young people.
- Schools 'buy in' to Integrated
 Offender Management process
- and therefore Police visit the young person in school to engage with them during school hours as well as in there home address and on the street.
- Strategy meeting within the young persons school that police attend.
- Strengthening families police officers allocated to each school.
 Early help referrals are seen by police at the first opportunity.
- Force Intelligence Bureau forms-School send direct to police.
- Direct conversations where a young person has a designated police offender manager on a regular basis.
- Bespoke inputs to school based on their needs which has normally been highlighted through the Wolverhampton Police and School Panel. I.E County Lines input, Gang affiliation input.

POLICE AND SCHOOL PANEL

Method

Paid membership to a two way information sharing partnership with designated police officer support.

Monthly meeting that all secondary schools in Wolverhampton attend with the exception of 2.

Police share:

- Convictions
- Arrests
- Intelligence
- Missing Person Information
- Safeguarding Information

Schools share onwards:

- Possession of knife on school premises
- Information regarding young persons risk of harm (victims and offenders)
- ABS trends
